## PETITION FOR CONTEMPT and ENFORCEMENT OF STIPULATED ORDER

Now comes, Media Swimming and Rowing Company and presents the following in support of its Motion For Contempt and Enforcement of Stipulated Order:

 This action had come before the Court as a result of Plaintiff's, the Borough of Media, Complaint for FILEU

PH 1:5

Declaratory Relief.

- Plaintiff had requested the Court to determine ownership interest of a portion of a dam/bridge which transverses Broomall Run and Lake at West Third Street, in the borough of Media.
- Defendants, Delaware County and Media Swimming and Rowing Club, had asked the court to determine that the Borough of Media owns the dam/bridge as a result of its ownership of the road and continuous use, maintenance, operation and control of said road, bridge/dam.
- 4. That after several years of litigation, negotiations etc. a settlement between Plaintiff and Defendants was reached on April 25, 2011 and entered as an Order of Court dated and signed by the Honorable James Proud on May 26, 2011. Said Stipulation and Order, assumingly settling the issues between the parties. A copy of said Stipulation and Order is attached hereto, made a part hereof and marked Exhibit "A".
- That since said Order was entered the Plaintiff has failed to proceed as Ordered.
- That the Plaintiff has failed to use due diligence in proceeding to design, engineer, repair, and improve the dam. See Stipulation and Order paragraph #6 (a)
- 7. That the Plaintiff has failed to used due diligence in proceeding to re-establish the West Third Street roadway across the dam as an open thoroughfare for vehicular and pedestrian traffic. See Stipulation and Order paragraph #6 (a).
- That Plaintiff through its present council intends to establish one way vehicular traffic across the dam.
- That Plaintiff intention to limit vehicular access to one way across the dam is contrary to the Stipulation and Order.
- 10. That at all times during the active use for a period of over 100 years the roadway across the dam accommodated two way vehicular traffic.
- 11. That the road way across the dam accommodated two way

vehicular traffic prior to said litigation.

- 12. That the road way across the dam was open to two way vehicular traffic prior to the closing of the road way.
- 13. That the intent and meaning of "reestablish the West Third Street roadway across the dam as an open thoroughfare for vehicular and pedestrian traffic;" pursuant to the Stipulation and Order was to restore the roadway to its former position.
- Black's Law Dictionary defines re-establish as to restore to its former position.
- 15. The Stipulation and Order entered into by the parties relied on the representation that said roadway would be re-established to its former position namely providing two way vehicular traffic.
- That Plaintiff's intent not to abide by said Stipulation and Order is a violation of said Order.
- That Plaintiff should be enjoined from any violation or deviation of said Order.
- That Plaintiff has delayed in acting pursuant to said Order.
- 19. That continued delay by the Plaintiff presents a dangerous condition as to the emergency access to the public, for emergency vehicles etc. in the event that access through Media to is obstructed or that said route would beneficially contribute to more immediate access and response.
- 20. That continued delay by the Plaintiff increases the risk that said roadway and damn could be breached or otherwise create a hazardous condition.
- That Plaintiff should incur cost and attorney fees for not abiding by said Order.

Wherefore, it is Defendant Media Swimming and Rowing Club request your Honorable Court to enter an Order enjoining Plaintiff from proceeding with plans for a one way roadway, Order Plaintiff to proceed with due diligence to comply with said Stipulation and Order, award reasonable attorney fees and enter such other relief as it deems just.
