

The first concert on Tuesday, June 29, 1937 had "classical and semi-classical numbers" performed by the Delaware County WPA Orchestra. A long-time favorite was the Chester City Band, performing from 1947 to as recently as 1982. Concerts drew as many as 1,500 people! In 1975, Delaware County's main summer concert series moved to a new, larger venue at Rose Tree Park.
