## Program of Music

For decades in Media, summers meant weekly concerts at the Glen Providence Park Stage. The first concert on Tuesday, June 29, 1937 had “classical and semi-classical numbers” performed by the Delaware County WPA Orchestra. A long-time favorite was the Chester City Band, performing from 1947 to as recently as 1982. Concerts drew as many as 1,500 people! In 1975, Delaware County’s main summer concert series moved to a new, larger venue at Rose Tree Park.

Now in 2012, Friends of Glen Providence Park is delighted to revive the tradition with the prestigious **Philadelphia Brass**.

From the stage of the Royal Albert Hall to the heights of the Bolivian Andes, Philadelphia Brass has delighted audiences with virtuosity, artistry and “cohesiveness seldom heard in live chamber music.” Formed in 1988, the ensemble performs the finest brass literature of all styles and periods. A top prizewinner in the prestigious Raphael Mendez Competition, Philadelphia Brass continues to promote the enjoyment of chamber music among audiences of all ages and interests.
